Introducing the "BRANCH BUZZ"



MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL TIME IS **STILL** HERE



Now is the time to renew your AAUW membership for 2021-2022. There are only two ways to do this and both are relatively convenient:

- 1. Online send me an email samsat@att.net- and I will have the correct renewal link sent to you. Contacting national AAUW directly will not work. However, with the renewal link it is rather easy. It is best to do this shortly after you get the link so it does not get lost in your email. The link from AAUW will say memberinfo@aauw.org.
- 2. The other way to renew is to send a \$105 check to me, Susan Myers, 3215 Garfield Ave., Alameda 94501. The check should be made out to AAUW-Alameda Branch. In October of 2020 the national AAUW Board of Directors voted to increase Individual Member dues for the next three years. The dues will rise by \$3 for 2021-2022, \$5 for 2022-2023, and \$5 for 2023-2024. All but \$3 of the national dues remains tax deductible.

We only have 18 members who have not yet renewed. I look forward to see your membership renewals.

That AAUW's official **mission statement** is: To advance gender equity for women and girls through research, education and advocacy.

That 2021 is the **140th anniversary** of our national organization!

That California AAUW sponsored 3 weeks of virtual Tek Trech Camps for **600 young women** in June 2021.

That the ERA, (Equal Rights Amendment) guaranteeing women the same rights as men under the US Constitution has only been ratified by 38 States. AAUW is encouraging us to write to our US Senators asking them to pass SJ Resolution 1 that would **make the ERA the 28th Amendment** to the Constitution.

That **Title IX rollbacks** in 2020 erased protection against sexual harassment and discrimination in schools. AAUW is working to counteract this.

That your membership and contributions can make a difference in advancing gender equity in many areas. It's important to continue our hard work!

Sept. 23, 2021 -- Understanding implicit/unconscious bias -- what is it, how does it manifest, recognizing your biases and how to interrupt them


