The second in a series of five Webinars being hosted by our National Inclusion and Equity Committee (IEC), an advisory body to the AAUW National Board of Directors, will occur on **Thursday, December 2, 2021, starting at 12:00 noon, PST.**

The Plug and Play resources in the Association's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Toolkit are meant to be used by local Branches to create programming and events around relevant topics. Each Plug and Play topic includes an explanation of the topic, guidelines for the facilitator(s), and discussion prompts to make the event and conversation as robust as possible.
