OAKLAND, CA – On International Women's Day, the Alameda Branch of the American Association of University Women (AAUW) has endorsed Lena Tam for Alameda County Supervisor in the open 3rd District seat.

"Lena Tam is an expert in her field, a highly qualified engineer with a passion for public service, who has led local government efforts for healthcare, housing and more," said Barbara Krummel, President of AAUW-Alameda Branch. "Lena is an exemplary candidate for County Supervisor, and AAUW enthusiastically endorses her."

"I know what it's like to be a professional woman in male dominated fields," **Lena Tam said.** "When I was pursuing my degrees in Civil and Environmental Engineering, I was one of the only women in my class. Today, I serve as one of the highest ranking women engineers in public service anywhere. I've broken many glass ceilings in my life, and I take that as a badge of honor as I pursue my greatest challenge yet: the campaign for Alameda County Supervisor. Thank you to AAUW for standing with me."

Lena Tam graduated with degrees in Civil and Environmental Engineering from UC Berkeley and the University of San Francisco. She has served as Vice Mayor of the City of Alameda, President of the City of Alameda Health Care Board, and Chair of the Alameda County Planning Board. She has worked for more than 30 years at the East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD), where she currently serves as the Manager of the Water Resources Planning Department.

She is running for County Supervisor in District 3, the seat long held by the late Supervisor Wilma Chan.

ED Fund Speaker Inspires Record Donations

Faheema Eissar, our February speaker, inspired great generosity to AAUW's Ed Fund with her compelling life story and undaunted pursuit of education, aided in part by a scholarship from AAUW.

From previous newsletters, you know about Faheema's remarkable journey from a completely uneducated Afghan 11-year-old to a thirty-plus year-old woman working on a master's degree in International Economic Development at the University of San Francisco, an endeavor made possible by financial help from AAUW. At age eleven, Faheema not only fast-tracked her education so she could graduate from high school at age 18 but learned English to boot, once afforded the

opportunity to go to school. She so valued education that saw to it that her six siblings also pursued their educations.

While Faheema cannot return to Afghanistan when she completes her degree next year to pursue her dream of helping her country, she plans to work in other developing nations to help women participate in the economic development of theirs. Therefore, AAUW's financial assistance will have a ripple effect for years to come for women all over the world.

Faheema's story sparked an outpouring of generosity, resulting in \$1930 in donations. This is the first West Coast survey of the work of American artist Alice Neel (1900-1984). This acclaimed exhibit originated at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. Neel spent most of her life living and working in New York City. Her work depicts the diversity, resilience, and passion of the people she encountered. Neel thought the term "portrait" sounded elitist. She said she "painted pictures" of her neighbors in Spanish Harlem, political leaders, queer cultural figures, activists, mothers, and a diverse representation of nude figures, including visibly pregnant women. She had this deeply empathetic and humanistic streak in her work. She was also an activist, which is reflected in her work.
