From the AAUW California website introducing Gov Trek: "This virtual program for high school junior and senior girls is designed to elevate the next generation to pursue careers in public service and elected office." Girls in middle and high school participate in six sessions in February and March, with activities culminating in a mock campaign for office.

AAUW Alameda Branch does not yet sponsor a Gov Trek program but we hope to start a program in the future. We look forward to Alaina describing her experience to us.

Also on the program for the meeting, activity group leaders and committee chairs will have a chance to explain their groups to the membership.
