If you are considering AAUW among your charitable year- end donations (and I hope you will!) our NCCWSL Branch Sponsorship program could greatly benefit from donations. We will award our \$1,500 scholarships to two College of Alameda women students to attend the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders in May 2024. This NCCWSL fund is set up as a 501(c)(3) Special project and administered by AAUW CA Special Projects Fund. Our Branch selects the students who are nominated by the College of Alameda. We have some funds left in our account but must raise \$1,600 to be able to send our students in May to the conference in Baltimore.

A Fundraising Oversight Committee has been created to give guidance to possible fundraising ideas and pursuits. Fundraising is important to our branch because we dream big.
