Each year before we send girls to camp, we invite them and their families to join us for an afternoon of delicious ice cream and an opportunity to hear from former campers about their experiences. This helps the girls and their families prepare for their time at camp. This year, Tech Trek committee member, Mary Kay Hardwick, opened her home and amazing waterfront backyard to us. All of the other committee members, Linda Preminger, Shubha Fanse, Marna Mitchell, Laura Porter and Jennifer Ayres (she made all of the fabulous ice creams and sorbets) helped with the party.





We had 8 campers this year: six attended camp at Sonoma State University and for the first time we sent two girls to camp at UC Santa Cruz.
